# Red tape gone, Red carpet remains

Democracy in India not only nurtures diversity but also the hopes of more than 1.25 billion people." He said his government was functioning not for a limited class or section but for all. PM Modi said terrorism is dangerous, reiterating that "it is worse when people create an artificial difference between "good' and 'bad' terror. It is painful to see some youngsters getting radicalised."

Referring to the fractures and fault lines at the international level that "are really frightening", the Prime Minister said "the biggest reasons are control of territories -- both direct and indirect -- and control of transactions, including cross border trade and movement of people".

### Sena to go solo in 2019 but will stay put in govt

It had even hobnobbed with the NCP, much to the discomfort of the Sena. Later, Sena ministers were denied plum portfolios. All this has much to do with the Shiv Sena's unanimous decision to go solo in all future elections.

Uddhav has been re-elected as party president while his son, Aditya, has been elevated as member of the party executive, keeping his post of Yuva Sena president intact. According to observers 27-year-old Aditya is on the ascendance and is likely to be projected as the youthful pan-India face of the party.

Dwelling on micro factors, a Sena leader said: "The BJP has taken a beating because of its inept handling of the loan waiver scheme for farmers, the Bhima-Koregaon violence and the Maratha reservation issue. This can have a cascading effect on the Sena's prospects as well."

"We had an ideological alliance with the BJP but in the past three years they have not left one single opportunity to demoralise us," MP Sanjay Raut said. I AM USED TO IT: FADNAVIS

Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis has downplayed the Shiv Sena threat to end their alliance. "We are used to it," Fadnavis said. Speaking on the sidelines of the World Economic Forum in Davos, Fadnavis, in an exclusive interview with India Today Television, said, "Let's wait, they have been saying many things. As of now we are in alliance in the government and this government will complete its term." The Chief Minister added, "There is little impact on governance by such threats. Have seen similar comments in the past as well and am used to [them] by now. The Shiv Sena-BJP alliance is right now functioning smoothly."

## **Cong not for impeachment**

Impeachment of the CJI or any Supreme Court or High Court judge requires support of a minimum of 50 MPs in the Rajya Sabha or a minimum of 100 Lok Sabha MPs. Without Congress, the Opposition's plan to support the CPM impeachment motion may not succeed.

Though the issues raised by the four judges still remain unresolved, the CJI has indicated to the judges that he would adopt the policy in the Bombay and the Delhi High Courts to decide subject-wise Benches to minimise any arbitrariness in appointment, which is the main issue raised by the four judges.

### Passenger dies on board flight, unassisted...

In fact, one of the co-passengers, Sakshi Bhardwaj, had attempted cardio resuscitation but all her efforts went in vain.

"Their response to the emergency was pathetic. My co-passenger died as he faced an issue of lack of oxygen and due to the delay in response he had a cardiac attack. It happened due to the negligence of the Jet staff since they failed to provide basic and initial medical support," said Bhardwaj.

She also confirmed, "Cabin member Balpreet further chided Ahmad and his family members for not taking blood pressure medicines, rather than providing him with oxygen and medical support. Later, a doctor on the flight tried to save Ahmad but it was too late," said Bhardwaj, who is a trained professional and can handle emergency situations.

"I could see the Jet staff was not trained to handle a medical emergency and were ill-equipped for providing basis medical support," she said. Ahmad, the only earning member of his family, is the native of Begusarai district of Bihar and he was travelling with his sister, niece and Alam. "We reached Patna by road and he was hale and hearty. There was no medical emergency till we boarded the Mumbai-bound Jet Airways flight," added Alam.

After the flight touched down in Mumbai, Ahmad's family had to wait for 30 minutes for the arrival of a doctor before they could take his body home. "They (the doctors) came and declared him dead," said Alam.

Later, Ahmed's body was taken to RN Cooper hospital where a post mortem examination was conducted.

# Probe jihad, not marriage

It observed that the criminal law issues cannot be clubbed with the question whether the marriage was valid or not. The NIA probe would make no difference to the status of Hadiya and Shafin's marriage, the Bench underlined.

It took the position when the NIA claimed it had made substantial progress in the investigation conducted after the Apex Court's direction in November.

"We are not concerned with it. Whether you carry on your investigation or arrest someone, we are not concerned, but you cannot investigate their marital status," the Bench said. It said the Apex Court was only concerned with the limited question of cancellation of Hadiya's marriage by the Kerala High Court in the Habeas Corpus petition before it.

"We will only examine whether the court can cancel the marriage. We can't question the legitimacy of her marriage. We are only concerned with the choice of an adult to marry someone. It is Hadiya who will decide who is a good human being or bad." the bench said.

# Screen Padma, it is an order, says CJI

Dismissing the state governments' plea to block the movie. the Bench, also comprising Justices A M Khanwilkar and D Y Chandrachud, said the people must understand that an order passed by the Apex Court has to be "abided by" and it is the obligation of the states to maintain law and order.

Admitting that maintaining the law and order was State's obligation, Additional Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Rajasthan government, urged the court to appreciate the ground situation and threat to

"You can't first create trouble and then make a virtue out of it" said Justice Chandrachud, Seeking a clarification, Mehta said there could be a situation where, after the release of the film, there is trouble in some parts.

"Let the State honour this order. The rest we will deal with when it comes to it", Justice Khanwilkar said. The CJI added that the states can approach the court again "if the situation arises."

When Mehta persisted that he was not asking for a ban on the film but certain modification in the court's interim order passed last Thursday, the CJI shut the case reaffirming that "we are not inclined to modify our order at this stage."

# Most transplanted trees are sans leaves

Environmentalists also complained that the area looked like a graveyard of trees. There were only stumps, without leaves and roots carelessly cut off. But when the Bombay High Court-appointed committee, comprising a group of citizens, visited the transplantation site in Juhu, they were surprised to see 54 trees swaying in full glory. Environmental groups had in June 2017 said that trees removed for transplantation from Metro III construction sites at Aarey Milk Colony may not survive as

they have not been replanted properly. Under the Maharashtra (Urban Areas) and Preservation of Trees Act, 1975, three new saplings have to be planted for every tree that is felled. A tree can also be transplanted at some other place. In compliance with the Tree Authority directives, MMRC had stated that they will plant three new trees for each that is axed.

# Aadhaar: Bill on data protection to be ready by March, Centre tells SC

The Centre on Tuesday told the Supreme Court that the much-awaited bill on data protection – being drafted by a committee of experts headed by Justice B.N. Srikrishna (retd) – would be ready by

Attorney General K.K. Venugopal gave the information to a Constitution Bench of Chief Justice Dipak Misra, Justice A.K. Sikri, Justice A.M. Khanwilkar. Justice D.Y. Chandrachud and Justice Ashok Bhushan, which is hearing a batch of petitions that challenged the constitutional validity of the Aadhaar Act as violative of the fundamental right to privacy, reports IANS.

Vedashree as its members. Continuing his arguments, senior counsel Shyam Divan took the court through the Aadhaar Act provisions to demonstrate that under the statute itself the demographic and biometric data of Indian citizens could be shared with private entities.

As the apex court said that if there were "deficiencies" in the Aadhaar scheme's implementation, resulting in leaks, the same could be plugged, Divan said: "It (collection of data) can't be reconciled with (working of) a democratic open society. The entire programme is bad as everyone is entitled to protect himself/herself against exposure of their demographic and biometric data.

As Divan dwelt on the scope and ramifications of various provisions of the Aadhaar Act, Justice Sikri said that 'let us assume that Aadhaar is constitutionally valid; still, we will have to decided whether it can be used for disbursal of subsidies or can be extended to other areas as well".

Justice Sikri said a line has to be drawn and the same can't be breached. Beyond that, it will be violative of privacy, the court observed.

In another poser, Justice Chandrachud asked if data collected under the Aadhaar scheme would be used only for the purposes for which it has been collected, would it ward off the dangers about which fears have been expressed before the court.

"All our personal data is anyway with private hands (collected by private agencies). Does interpolation of Aadhaar number make any difference," Justice Chandrachud asked, pointing out "we are living in an extremely networked world".

Telling the court that the way Aadhaar was being linked with everything "you will have a huge proliferation of data for the purpose of identification", Divan said: "Lift your imagination much higher than where we are", understand the implications of the state possessing the biometric data of the citizens.

Telling the court that the only thing that remains a secret is the one that goes with the demise of a person, senior counsel Kapil Sibal said that there was nothing secret in the world.

# India-Russia to sign contract for 48 Mi-17 choppers by March: Rostec

He also said that there is "serious modernisation potential" in the Mi-17 and Mi-8 choppers which was proven by the development of the Mi-171A2 helicopter.

8/17 series with more powerful propulsion systems, up-A contract for Mi-17V-5 heli-graded main rotor, gear systems and fuselage and advanced avionics. Chemezov said the chopper has seen more than 80 new improvements in the platform.

India at present has around 151 Mi-17V-5 helicopters, the last of which were delivered in January 2016. The Mi-17V-5 is based on the Mi 8 helicopter airframe and is one of the most advanced aircraft of the Mi-8/17 helicopter family.

The helicopters equipped with night vision technology, on-board weather radar, a new PKV-8 autopilot system, and a KNEI-8 avionics suite.

The sturdy choppers have been the Indian Air Force's mainstay in a number of humanitarian assistance and disaster relief operations.
